BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

This MOU will establish William Conrad, Ed.D., Assessment Coordinator for ACOE as a provider of professional development services for AUSD staff. The scope of Dr. Conrad's work will include presentations on the effective use and presentation of data, the differences between formative and summative assessments and how to use the data to inform instruction. He will also assist in the development of a district-wide K-5 grade mathematics assessment plan based on the Everyday Mathematics Program.

The MOU outlines a total of 12 professional development sessions (2 full days and 10 two-hour sessions scheduled at various times throughout the year) for a total cost not to exceed \$4,200 and aligns with the AUSD Strategic Plan.

Conrad, III, Ed.D. and Albany Unified School District, its officers and/or employees, the liability for any and all claims for injuries which arise out of the performance of this contract shall be apportioned under "California's Theory of Comparative Negligence" as presently established or as may hereafter be modified.

G. Affirmative Action/Nondiscrimination

William H. Conrad, III, Ed.D. shall provide services and activities under this contract that do not restrict the participation nor otherwise discriminate among participants and staff with regard to their race, color, religion, age, sex, ancestry, or national origin.

H. Assignment of Sub-Contract

William H. Conrad, III, Ed.D. shall not assign or transfer, by operation or law or otherwise, any or all of their rights, burdens, duties, or obligations, without the prior written consent of Albany Unified School District.

I. Amendment/Termination of Contract

This agreement may be amended or altered on terms and conditions mutually agreed upon by the parties hereto. If either party terminates this agreement before the ending date, Albany Unified School District agrees to pay actual costs to date.

This Memorandum of Understanding will establish the East Bay Center for the Performing Arts as the provider of the Albany Unified School District's Staggered Reading (Early Bird/Late Bird) Enrichment Program at Cornell, Marin, and Ocean View schools for the 2010-11 school year.

The East Bay Center for the Performing Arts provided the pilot program for the 2009-10 school year. Albany Unified School District is recommending that the partnership with East Bay Center be continued for the 2010-11 school year.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING Between East Bay Center for the Performing Arts And Albany Unified School District

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) has been entered into by East Bay Center for the Performing Arts (EBCPA) and Albany Unified School District, for the period of September 1, 2010 to June 10, 2011.

This MOU confirms a commitment between EBCPA and Albany Unified to support programming for the Albany Enrichment Program which will take place at Ocean View, Marin, and Cornell Elementary Schools in Albany, California. The classes are open to all 1st- 3rd graders.

- Four classes will be offered on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays at each school site, if spaces are available. Two classes will be offered 8:30 am 9:30 am and two classes will be offered 2:05 pm 3:05 pm. The classes will be divided into trimesters. Some classes will meet twice weekly and others once weekly. One class at each site will accommodate 10 15 students and the other will accommodate 15 20. Although all class offerings will be available at all schools, they may not be available during the same trimester. The cost will be \$7 per class except for classes in foreign language which will be \$11 per session. It would be open to all 1st 3rd graders but limited to a maximum of 70 students at each of the three sites for a total of 210 students. If enrollment falls below certain numbers (see below) EBCPA reserves the right to cancel a class. Fees will be paid by the parents directly to EBCPA.
- On Wednesday one class will be offered from 1:45 3:00 pm at Cornell, Marin and Ocean View Schools if appropriate space is available. The classes will be divided into trimesters of 10 12 weeks. Each class will accommodate up to 20 students. The cost will be \$10 a session. Fees will be paid by the parents directly to EBCPA.
- Scholarships will be available for up to 8% of the class slots. Scholarship students will pay a fee of \$1 per class session. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of free and reduced lunches. District administrators will supply necessary information to EBPCA to award scholarship slots. The cost of scholarships will be contributed by EBCPA.
- Enrollment for 25% of the available slots will open approximately June 11. This is prior to the publication of the class schedule and is done so that parents will have the opportunity to secure a slot and plan for childcare needs. There will be a non-refundable deposit of \$25 collected and credited towards class fees. The remaining slots will be available in mid-August concurrent with the announcement of early/late bird status. The schedule will be published at the same time. Class registration will be open for one week and, if necessary, a lottery will be held at that time if there are more students than slots available. If there are open slots students will be able to join classes at any time. The program will begin no later than Monday, September 13, 2010 and end approximately June 3, 2011.
- Information for the program will be made available through school take home packets, email trees, printed material and on the EBCPA website, www.eastbaycenter.org. EBCPA will make a reasonable attempt to reach all parents but cannot guarantee 100% coverage.

The East Bay Center will provide: The East Bay Center will provide:

- Administration of the program including:
 - o Billing and bookkeeping. Payments will be made by parents either once or twice every trimester.
 - Administration of scholarship program. Note that 8% of class slots would be available for scholarship students and Albany schools would be responsible for making financial need determinations (see below)
 - o Hiring of teachers and subcontractors (all instructors will be cleared through LiveScan fingerprinting, have TB testing, and will have taken classes in Child Abuse reporting)
 - Payment of teachers and subcontractors
 - o Holding of a \$3,000,000 liability policy
 - Onsite supervision to handle customer service (the East Bay Center will assign a staff member to oversee the program. That staff member will be in Albany 4 days a week during class times rotating between the school sites and on-call five days a week. That staffer will also have email and phone for communicating with parents. If there are complaints that staffer will be empowered to resolve them, if further resolution is needed the head of the Department of Art & Public Education at the East Bay Center will work with the parents to resolve the issue. This mirrors our procedures at the Main Site that have been successful for 30 years an on site Registrar is empowered to resolve most issues and is supported by the head of the Artists/Repertory Department.)
 - o An Albany Enrichment page at <u>www.eastbaycenter.org</u> for information, payments, comments, and concerns
 - Overall quality control

Classes

- o Information, fliers and a web page to provide information to parents
- Registration and billing materials (Payments will be made in advance)
- O A range of visual and performing art classes taught by faculty of the East Bay Center
- O Supplies and materials for classes will be provided by the East Bay Center, except in cases where the teacher suggests supplemental supplies and materials, such as Taekwondo uniforms and Lango study books. In this case the parents will be notified of the fees and they will be paid directly to the teacher. The payment of supplemental fees are not mandatory for admission to the classes.
- Foreign language classes taught by LangoKids. These classes will be offered twice a week at each school site for all three trimesters.
- o If appropriate, performances and exhibitions will be presented. Time and location will be determined by mutual consent of the instructor, the East Bay Center, school administration, and the parent advisory council
- A variety of classes in performing arts, visual arts, science, ecology, chess, Taekwondo, foreign languages, dance, etc.

Albany schools will provide:

- Contact with Albany Unified School District will be made through Lynda Hornada and school site Principals.
- Appropriate communication channels to parents
- Each school site will provide two classrooms, one appropriate for 15 students and one appropriate for 20 students.
- Janitorial service will be provided by the schools. Classrooms will be open 15 minutes prior to morning classes and ready for instruction.

- The larger classroom must have open space available for dance, movement, theater classes, etc. The classrooms will be appropriate to the pedagogical needs of each class. If appropriate spaces are not available EBCPA may not be able to offer all classes at all schools.
- Appropriate secure storage at each school site will be provided for materials.
- Each school is responsible for determining which students will receive scholarships. The school leadership and/or representatives of AUSD will notify the East Bay Center who those students are.
- Support to the East Bay Center when parents are in arrears. Students attending classes when payments are in arrears will be asked to leave the class. EBPCA assumes no responsibility for students who have been asked to leave because of non-payment of class fees.

Additional Program Scope:

- This is not a drop in program. The East Bay Center assumes no liability for students who are on the school grounds but not enrolled in classes.
- Parents will enroll students for an entire trimester and pay in advance. There will be no pro-rating
 for vacations or absences. Students may drop out during the first two weeks of classes and receive
 a full refund minus payment for the class(es) attended. Refunds after the initial two week period
 of each trimester are not guaranteed and will be made solely at the discretion of the EBPCA
 Program Manager and/or department Director.
- Parents may enroll students one, two, three or four days per week but must enroll students for the
 entire trimester. If the class meets twice a week parents must enroll students and pay for both
 class meetings.
- If demand exists for additional classes and Albany schools is able to provide appropriate space, the East Bay Center will offer additional classes. These classes will come from the current class offerings. It is possible that these additional classes may be only offered at one or two school sites, depending on demand.
- For small classrooms, there would be a minimum of 7 students and a maximum of 15. The large classrooms there would be a minimum of 12 and a maximum of 20.
- Any additional revenues above those projected in the budget will go to support the overhead costs
 at the East Bay Center (in the projected budget the overhead costs are only about 10%, much
 lower than standard) as well as administration, start-up costs and professional development for
 teachers. Additional revenues may also go to support additional classes, depending on demand.
- The proposed classes are subject to change based on teacher availability and student interest.
- The East Bay Center has extensive development expertise. We would work with the Albany schools if appropriate RFPs for outside funding arise.

All programming is subject to review by the Albany Unified School District. All good faith efforts to fulfill the commitments stated above shall be made and recognized. Any changes to this MOU shall be made in writing and agreed to by all parties.

I. TERMS OF THE CONTRACT

A. This Agreement will become effective as of the date above and will continue in effect through June 30, 2010 unless sooner terminated.

II. SCOPE OF WORK TO BE PERFORMED BY CONTRACTOR

- A. Contractor agrees to perform the services specified in the "Description of Services" attached to this Agreement and incorporated by reference herein as Exhibit "A".
- B. Contractor shall perform within the time set forth in Exhibit "A"; everything required to be performed.

III. COMPENSATION

- A. In consideration for the services and/or materials referenced in Article II of works scope of work by contract, District agrees to pay 120/NR for 51 W 10 CKCCAN Unless otherwise provided for in Article II, payment of expenses shall be made within sixty (60) days upon completion/delivery of goods and accompanied by invoices and appropriate supporting documentation.

 Invoices shall be submitted to the attention of the Albany Unified School District, Attention: Accounts Payable, along with completed W-9 Form (copy attached).
- B. The District reserves the right to withhold payment until order is completed and/or accepted by the District.

IV. OBLIGATION OF CONTRACTOR

- A. While performing services hereunder, Contractor is an independent contractor and not an officer, agent or employee of the District.
- B. The Contractor shall provide and furnish all necessary tools, labor, materials, equipment and all transportation services as described and required to perform the services under this Agreement. The Contractor shall assume all other expenses incurred in connection with the performance of this contract and the District shall not be responsible for payment of any other expenses. The Contractor is personally liable for among other things, taxes, personal health and car insurance. Workers'

Compensation for his/her own employees and business expenses for maintaining his/her office.

C. The Contractor shall not assign, transfer, convey, sublet or other wise dispose of this contract or its right, title or interest therein, or any part thereof, such attached or purported assignments, transfer, conveyance, sublease or other disposition shall be null, void and of no legal effect whatsoever, and the contract may, at the option of the District be terminated, revoked and annulled, and the District shall thereupon be relieved and discharged from any and all liability and obligations growing out of the same to the contractor, and to its purported assignee or transferee.

Item IV-D () is () is not applicable to this agreement.

D. Sections 1771 through 1775 of the Labor Code are hereby made part of this agreement as if written in its entirety herein.

- E. All equipment, supplies and services sold to the District shall conform to the general safety orders of the State of California.
- F. It is the policy of the District that in connection with all work performed under any and all contracts, including independent contractor agreements, there will be no discrimination against any prospective or active employee engaged in the work because of race, color, ancestry, national origin, religious creed, sex, age, physical handicap, medical condition or marital status. In the performance of the terms of this contract, Contractor agrees to comply with applicable Federal and California laws including, but not limited, to the California Fair Employment and Housing Act, beginning with Government Code Section 12900, and labor Code Section 1735, and agrees that it will not engage in nor permit any subcontractor as it may employ to engage in unlawful discrimination in the employment of persons because of race, color, ancestry, religious creed, national origin, age, physical handicap, medical condition, marital status, or sex of such person.

V. LIABILITY

The Contractor agrees to hold harmless and to indemnify the District for any injury to person or property sustained by the Contractor, by any person, firm or corporation, employed directly or indirectly by the Contractor, or by any of the individuals participating in, or associated with, the Contractor, however, caused. The Contractor further agrees to hold harmless and to indemnify the District for any injury to person or property sustained by any person, firm or corporation, caused by any act, neglect, default or omission of the Contractor, or of any person, firm or Corporation directly or indirectly employed by the Contractor upon or in connection with this Agreement, or any of the participants arising out of or in the course of the term of this Agreement, and the contractor, at his/her own cost, expense and risk, shall defend any and all actions, suits or other legal proceedings that any be instituted against the District for any such

claim or demand and pay or satisfy and judgment, including attorney fees and costs, that may be rendered against the District in any such action, suit or legal proceeding.

VI. ENTIRETY OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement supersedes any and all agreements, either oral or written. between the parties hereto with respect to the rendering of services by Contractor for the District and contains all the covenants and agreements between the parties. Each party to this Agreement acknowledges that no representations, inducements, promises, or agreements, orally or otherwise, have been made by any party, or anyone acting on behalf of any party, which are not embodied herein, and that no other agreement, statement or promise not contained in this Agreement shall be valid or binding. Any modification of this Agreement will be effective only if it is in writing, signed and dated by both the Contractor and the District.

If any provision in this Agreement is held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, void, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will nevertheless continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way.

VII. ATTORNEY FEES

If any action at law or in equity, including an action for declamatory relief, is brought to enforce or interpret the provisions of this Agreement, the prevailing party will be entitled to reasonable attorney fees, which may be set by the court in the same action or in a separate action brought for the purpose, in addition to any other relief to which the party may be entitled.

This Agreement will be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

1. MASTER CONTRACT

This Master Contract is entered into this 28th day of April, 2010, between the Albany Unified School District (hereinafter referred to as "LEA" and SENECA CENTER (hereinafter referred to as "CONTRACTOR") for the purpose of providing special education and/or related services to LEA pupils with exceptional needs under the authorization of California Education Code sections 56157, 56361 and 56365 et seq. and Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations section 3000 et seq., AB490 (Chapter 862, Statutes of 2003) and AB1858 (Chapter 914, Statutes of 2004). It is understood that this Master Contract does not commit LEA to pay for special education and/or related services provided to any LEA pupil, or CONTRACTOR to provide such special education and/or related services, unless and until an authorized LEA representative approves the provision of special education and/or related services by CONTRACTOR pursuant to an Individualized Education Plan (hereinafter referred to as "IEP"), Individual Family Service Plan (hereinafter referred to as IFSP) or Rehabilitation Act Section 504 plan.

SELPA Collaborative. The LEA is a member of the Bay Area SELPA Collaborative. Nonpublic schools and nonpublic agencies that are geographically located in one of the participating SELPAs agree to participate in this collaborative process to establish a uniform contract for identified services and standards. The established system provides NPA/Ss with an opportunity to have input to the development of the process, contract issues, etc., and a simplified, standard process for rate negotiation with the participating SELPAs. Issues listed on the Rate Schedule portion of this Master Contract may be reviewed on an annual basis upon request of the CONTRACTOR using the established Bay Area SELPA Collaborative system. CONTRACTOR agrees that the rates set forth in this Master Contract will remain unchanged from July 1 through June 30 of the term of contract, with no changes in the services provided, unless changed in a duly executed amendment to this Master Contract signed by both parties. Increases in rates will be considered on an annual basis and remain unchanged for the term of the contract from July 1 through June 30, with no changes in level of service provided without written approval by both parties.

NPA/Ss that are not geographically located in a participating SELPA should negotiate rates with their geographically corresponding SELPA(s). The LEA will contact the corresponding SELPA to verify established rates. Increases in rates will be considered on an annual basis and

RECOMMENDATION: Conduct 2nd reading and approve AR 5111.1 – District Residency and BP/AR 5117 – Interdistrict Attendance (Students)

Students AR 5111.1(a)

DISTRICT RESIDENCY

Criteria for Residency

Prior to admission in district schools, proof must be provided that the student resides with his/her parent or guardian within the boundaries of the district. Residency is defined by Government Code sections 243 and 244 as follows:

- 1. Every person has, in law, a residence.
- 2. <u>In determining the place of residence the following rules shall be observed:</u>
 - a. It is the place where one remains when not called elsewhere for labor or other special or temporary purpose, and to which he or she returns in seasons of repose.
 - b. There can only be one residence
 - c. A residence cannot be lost until another is gained.
 - d. A residence of the parent with whom an unmarried minor child maintains his or her place of abode is the residence of such unmarried minor child
 - e. The residence of an unmarried minor who has a parent living cannot be changed by his or her own act.
 - f. The residence can be changed only by the union of act and intent.

A student shall be deemed to have complied with district residency requirements if he/she provides evidence considered sufficient to the Superintendent that s/he meets any of the following criteria:

1. The student's parent/guardian resides within district boundaries, <u>as residence is defined in Government Code section 244</u> on a full-time permanent basis that is seven days and seven nights (one week). (Education Code 48200)

(cf. 5111.13 - Residency for Homeless Children) (cf. 6173 - Education for Homeless Children)

2. The student is placed within district boundaries in a regularly established licensed children's institution, or a licensed foster home, or a family home pursuant to a court-ordered commitment or placement. (Education Code 48204)

(cf. 6173.1 - Education for Foster Youth)

3. The student has been admitted through the district's interdistrict attendance program process. (Education Code 48204)

(cf. 5117 - Interdistrict Attendance)

- 4. The student is an emancipated minor residing within district boundaries. (Education Code 48204)
- 5. The student lives with a caregiving adult within district boundaries. A caregiver affidavit must be completed and on file with the District Office. The caregiving adult must execute the affidavit under penalty of perjury and all affidavits must be notarized. (Education Code 48204)
- 6. The student resides in a state hospital located within district boundaries.
- 7. The student is confined to a hospital or other residential health facility within district boundaries for treatment of a temporary disability.

(cf. 6183 - Home and Hospital Instruction)

District residency is not required for enrollment in a regional occupational center or program if there are openings in the program or class. (Education Code 52317)

The Superintendent or designee shall annually notify parents/guardians of all existing attendance options available in the district, including, but not limited to, all options for meeting residency requirements for school attendance. (Education Code 48980)

(cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

Proof of Residency

A student shall be deemed to have complied with residency requirements if he/she provides evidence considered sufficient by the Superintendent that he/she meets any of the following criteria:

- 1. The student and his/her parent/legal guardian reside within district boundaries
- 2. The student is placed within district boundaries in a regularly established, licensed children's institution, or a licensed foster home, or a family home pursuant to a court-ordered commitment or placement.
- 3. The student has been admitted through the district's interdistrict attendance program.
- 4. The student is an emancipated minor residing within district boundaries.

- 5. The student resides in the home of an approved caregiver adult living within district boundaries.
- 6. The student resides in a hospital or other state licensed medical facility within district boundaries.
- 7. The student is participating in a federally approved international student exchange program and the host family resides within the district boundaries.

The district must be notified of changes in residency within 72 hours of the change.

District residency is not required for enrollment in a regional occupational center or program (ROC or ROP) if there are openings in the program or class.

Prior to admission into district schools, students shall provide proof of residency. A student can have only one residence for purposes of establishing residency. The Superintendent or designee shall annually verify the student's residency and retain a copy of the document(s) offered as verification. Reasonable evidence of residency may be established by documentation including, but not limited to, one form of documentation from each of the following groups: (UC Berkeley Village residents — Group D only Group D only UC Berkeley Village residents)

Group A:

- Current Passport,
- Driver's License with Vehicle Registration or other DMV verification
- California Identification Card,
- Federal or State Governmental Identification Card.

Group B:

- Current Rental/Lease Agreement (with the following: Parent/Guardian name, students name(s), name of owner or manager and telephone number—sub leases will not be accepted),
- Current Property Tax Bill,
- Current Homeowner or Renter's Insurance Policy.

Group C:

- State or Federal Tax Returns with W-2 attached,
- Payroll Check Stub with name and address.
- Other form of identification or correspondence from a government agency.

Group D: (For residents of UC Berkeley Village Only)

• Residents of UC Berkeley Village need to provide a copy of the current rental agreement that lists all persons living in the unit.

Prior to admission to district schools, the student's parent, guardian or caregiver shall provide proof of residency. A student can only have one residence for purposes of establishing residency. At least three proofs of residency shall be submitted. Documents must be preprinted with the name and address of the student's parent, guardian, or caregiver.

At least one original document (photocopies will not be accepted) must be submitted from each of the following three categories: (UC Berkeley Village residents – Category Four only)

Category One

- * Valid California driver's license
- *Valid California photo identification card
- * Valid passport
- *Government-issued photo identification card

Category Two

Utility service payment receipts (dated within past sixty days).

- * PG & E bill
- *EBMUD
- *Home telephone bill
- * Cable television bill

Category Three

- * Property tax payment receipt stub showing homeowner exemption (dated within past year)
- * Copy of deed AND record of most recent mortgage payment
- * Copy of lease AND record of most recent rent payment

Category Four (For residents of UC Berkeley Village - Only)

* Current rental agreement that lists all persons living in the unit

The district may request verification of residency at any time. After the initial verification, the district may require proof of continued residency at such intervals (e.g., monthly, quarterly, annually) as may be deemed appropriate. Unannounced home visitations may be conducted to verify residency at any time during the student's attendance in the District.

A parent or guardian of a student who was admitted to the district based on the location of the parent or guardian's employment must initially and annually verify employment of at least twenty hours per week for at least thirty weeks per year. Proof will include a copy of a W-2 form (dated within the past year) supported by written verification by the employer. If the parent or guardian is self-employed, the parent or guardian must provide written verification in the form of a declaration under penalty of perjury.

Text Box 1

Note: Students on an approved interdistrict <u>attendance</u> permit must annually verify the residency requirement as stated above. A change of address from the time when an interdistrict permit was first approved (<u>from one district to another</u>) will require a new interdistrict transfer application and will be subject to the restrictions of the interdistrict transfer permit into the Albany Unified School District. Student moves from district "A" to district "B" and wants to continue on an inter-district transfer. Because interdistrict transfers must be approved by each school district involved, a new request must be submitted for approval.

When presented with a substitute address designated by the Secretary of State for victims of domestic violence or stalking residing within district boundaries, the Superintendent or designee shall accept and use the substitute address for all future communication and correspondence and in all public records.

In the event that the district determines that residency has not been established, the student affected shall either be denied enrollment, or if already enrolled, shall be disenrolled effective not less that five school days from the date that the parent or legal guardian was notified of the residency determination. The Superintendent may delay the disenrollement until the end of the semester if the student is in the last trisemester of that term.

The Superintendent shall conduct an investigation to determine the student' and parents/guardians' residency when provided reasonable information that the enrollment was based on false evidence of residency.

Safe at Home Program

When a student or parent/guardian participating in the Safe at Home program requests that the district use the substitute address designated by the Secretary of State, the Superintendent or designee may request the actual residence address for the purpose of establishing residency within the district's boundaries. The Superintendent or designee shall not include the actual address in the student's file or any other public record and shall instead use the substitute address for all future communications and correspondence.

Denial or Revocation of Enrollment

If any district employee or member of the public reasonably believes that the parent/guardian or a student has provided false or unreliable evidence of residency, the employee or other individual may address their concerns to the Superintendent or designee. If the Superintendent or designee, upon investigation, determines that the student's enrollment or attempted enrollment is based upon false evidence of residency, s/he shall revoke the student's enrollment.

Before such revocation, the parent/guardian shall be sent written notice, summarizing the facts and evidence leading to the decision. This notice shall state the parent/guardian's right to schedule a meeting to take place within ten school days of the date of the notice with the

Superintendent or designee. At the meeting, the parent/guardian will be provided an opportunity to rebut the district's evidence, and to present oral and/or documentary evidence, including witnesses, on the student's behalf. If the parent/guardian fails to schedule the above meeting, the student's enrollment shall be terminated eleven school days after the notice.

The Superintendent or designee's decision shall be final.

Legal Reference:

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

Interdistrict Attendance Permits

California state law and the rules and regulations of the State Board of Education state a preference that students attend schools in their districts of residency. The district Board of Education believes that children should attend schools where they live. The Board shall consider requests for interdistrict attendance agreements in accordance with this general principal principal.

The Board of Education recognizes that students who reside in one <u>school</u> district may <u>ehoose</u> <u>wish</u> to attend school in another <u>school</u> district and that such choices are made for a variety of reasons. <u>Because of capacity issues within the district and due to limited resources</u>, the Board will consider approving such transfers on a case-by-case basis through an interdistrict transfer agreement with another school district. In the case of a student wishing to transfer into the district, the request will be considered when class enrollment or program availability will permit the attendance of an out-of-district student.

(cf. 5116.1 - Intradistrict Open Enrollment)

The Board desires to communicate with parents/guardians and students regarding the district's educational programs and services.

The Board recognizes that the district may be capable of serving additional students. Upon request by students' parents/guardians, the Superintendent or designee may approve interdistrict attendance permits with other districts on a case by case basis to meet individual student needs.

The interdistrict attendance permit shall not exceed a term of five years and shall stipulate the terms and conditions under which interdistrict attendance shall be permitted or denied. (Education Code 46600)

The Superintendent or designee may deny interdistrict attendance permits because of overcrowding within district schools or limited district resources.

In the event that space is not available for all interdistrict transfer requests, the following priority will be used:

- 1st Priority: Albany Unified School District Employees (must work .40 FTE or more)
- 2nd Priority: City of Albany-Employees (employed at least 20 hours a week)
- 3rd Priority: Children with a currently enrolled sibling(s) and would be concurrently enrolled in the district at the same time.
- 4th-Priority: All other applicants.

The Superintendent or designee of the district shall review all requests for interdistrict attendance agreements. The Superintendent is authorized to grant or deny interdistrict attendance requests.

The decision to admit out-of-district students is discretionary. When capacity exists, applications may be approved based on the following priorities:

1st Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employees of the Albany Unified School District (must work .40 FTE or more).

- 2nd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are business owners/operators within district boundaries.
- 3rd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employed by the City of Albany (employed at least 20 hours per week)
- 4th Priority: All other applicants.
- 1st Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employees of the Albany Unified School District (must work .40 FTE or more).
- 2nd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employed by the City of Albany, or employed within the district boundaries (employed at least 20 hours per week).
- 3rd Priority: Students whose siblings are ongoing interdistrict transfer students.
- 4th Priority: Students whose requests are based on a desire to ensure educational continuity.
- 5th Priority: All other applicants.

Notwithstanding these priorities, the Superintendent/designee may grant a transfer if, in the judgement of the Superintendent Superintendent/designee, the parents/guardians provide evidence of extraordinary circumstances warranting a transfer.

The Superintendent or designee may deny applications for interdistrict transfers due to space limitations or other non-discriminatory reasons. The Superintendent or designee may also revoke an interdistrict transfer permit for non-discriminatory reasons.

The parent/guardian of a student who is denied a transfer request pursuant to Education Code sections 46600-46611 shall receive timely notice, in accordance with law, regarding the

process for appeal to the Albany Unified School District Board of Education, and to the County Board of Education. A student whose request for transfer is based on his/her parent's employment within the district's boundaries, including employment by the district, shall not have the right to appeal a denial to the County Board.

Students who have been expelled from other school districts may not be admitted to the district on interdistrict attendance agreements during the period of their expulsions. Students who are under consideration for expulsion or who have been expelled may not appeal interdistrict attendance denials while expulsion proceedings are pending, or during the term of the expulsion.

<u>Transportation will not be provided for students attending the district on interdistrict transfer agreements.</u>

INTERDISTRICT ATTENDANCE

Interdistrict Attendance Permits

General Information

Requests for interdistrict attendance permits, both incoming and outgoing, shall be submitted to the employee in charge of interdistrict requests and reviewd reviewed by the Superintendent or designee. All requests, whether into or out of the district, are for one school year only and must be renewed annually. For transfers into the district, the student and parent/guardian must sign an Interdistrict Transfer Student Contract annually.

Each transfer request will be judged on its individual merits. All factual information and supporting documentation submitted with the transfer request will be subject to verification. Any transfer request containing or based upon false information will be denied or revoked, and the parent or guardian responsible will be referred to the appropriate legal authorities.

Subject to the priorities established by BP 5117, the Superintendent or designee may approve Interdistrict Attendance Agreements for the following reasons:

- 1. The student has a parent who is employed by the Albany Unified School District.

 Certificated and Classified employees must be employed at least 40 percent of fulltime.
- 2. The student has a parent who is employed by the City of Albany. The parent must be employed in a paid position for a minimum of 20 hours per week annually. Proof of employment must be submitted annually and may be required by the district at any time.
- 3. When a student has a sibling(s) attending school in the receiving district, to avoid splitting the family's attendance
- 4. To allow children who have been enrolled in AUSD schools at the time their parents/guardians move out of the district including:
 - a. To allow students to remain with a class-graduating that year from an elementary, junior or senior high school
 - b. To let high school seniors attend the same school they attended as juniors, even if their families moved out of the district during the junior year
 - c. When a student will be living out of the district for one year or less
- 5. To allow a student whose family is renovating or building a new home in Albany, the student may be admitted upon submission of all of the following:

- a. A written statement by the parent/guardian certifying that construction has begun, with completion expected prior to the end of the semester
- b. A building permit issued by the City of Albany
- c. Proof that construction (pouring of foundation and/or actual erection of forms)
 is under way
- 6. To meet the child care needs of a student. Such students may be allowed to continue to attend district schools only as long as they continue to use a child care provider within district boundaries
- 7. When the parent/guardian provides written-evidence that the family will be moving into the district in the immediate future and would like the student to start the year in the district
- 8. To meet a child's special-mental or physical health needs as certified by a physician, school psychologist, or other appropriate school personnel

(cf. 6159 Individualized Education Program)

9. When recommended by the School Attendance Review Board or by county child welfare, probation, or social service agency staff in documented cases of serious home or community problems which make it inadvisable for the student to attend the school of residence

(cf. 5113.1 Truancy)

- 10. When there is valid interest in a particular educational program not offered in the district of residence
- 11. To provide a change in school environment for reasons of personal and social adjustment

Per BP 5116.1: In the event that space is not available for all interdistrict transfer requests, the following priority will be used:

<u>1st Priority</u>: Albany Unified School District Employees (must work .40 FTE or more) #1 above

2nd Priority: City of Albany Employees (employed at least 20 hours a week) #2 above

<u>3rd Priority</u>: a) Children with a currently enrolled sibling(s) who would be enrolled in the district at the same time. b) Children who have been enrolled in AUSD schools at the time their parents/guardians move out of the district.

4th Priority: All other applicants. #5-11 above

The school site and teacher assignment of children whose parents/guardians' residences are located outside the district will be the responsibility of the district in order to balance class size and composition. It may be necessary to have students move to different sites in subsequent school years.

Requests for Interdistrict Attendance Permits Into the District

- 1. The parent/guardian must first obtain approval for the student's transfer from the student's current district of residence on the appropriate form.
- 2. The Superintendent or designee may approve, deny or place on the waiting list requests for new interdistrict attendance permits that are approved by the district of residence and submitted to the Albany Unified School District by June 1 for the following school year. Applicants will be advised by the first week of the school year as to whether their applications have been approved, denied or wait-listed.
- 3. The Superintendent or designee may deny requests for interdistrict attendance permits if the district's facilities are overcrowded at the relevant grade level and based on other nonarbitrary considerations.
- 4. If the request for transfer is approved, the district retains the authority right to determine the specific school to which the student will be assigned. However, the district will attempt to accommodate a parent/guardian's request for placement in a specific school site, subject to the priorities and policies established in the district's residency regulations.
- 5. If the request for transfer is denied, the parent/guardian will be notified in writing of the right to appeal to the district Board of Education. If the appeal is denied by the Board of Education, the parent/guardian will be notified in writing regarding the process for appeal to the County Board of Education. An appeal to the County Board of Education must be made within thirty days of the district Board's denial. A student whose request for transfer is based on his/her parent's employment within the district's boundaries, including employment by the district, shall not have the right to appeal a denial to the County Board.

The Board requires that all requests for interdistrict attendance and the required supporting documentation be certified by the parent, guardian, childcare provider or caregiver under

penalty of perjury. The Superintendent or designee is responsible for confirming the accuracy of information contained in such requests and documentation; investigating any suspicion that information has been falsified; reporting such violations to the appropriate law enforcement agencies; and reporting such activities to the Board.

Requests for Renewal of Interdistrict Attendance Permits Into the District

Requests for renewal of interdistrict attendance permits into the district will be reviewed according to the process for new interdistrict attendance permits, with the following exceptions:

- 1. A request for renewal of an interdistrict attendance permit must be submitted by April 1st. Applicants will be advised by June 1 whether the application is approved or denied.
- 2. A request for renewal of an interdistrict attendance permit submitted after April 1 will be processed as a new request.
- 3. If admission to the district was approved based on the location of the student's parent's employment, the student shall be allowed to attend school in the district through the 12th grade, if the parent/guardian so chooses, subject to (1) annual completion of the interdistrict application by the April 1st deadline to verify continued employment within the district according to proof acceptable to the district, consistent with the district's Residency Policy and Regulations; and (2) any other limitation as allowed by law, including violations of the Interdistrict Transfer Student Contract.

Grounds for Approval

The Superintendent or designee may approve interdistrict attendance permits when capacity within the district exists. Students whose requests are denied solely because of lack of capacity within the district will be placed on a waiting list, and their applications will be considered if space becomes available.

Applications may be approved based on the following priorities:

1st Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employees of the Albany Unified School District (must work .40 FTE or more).

- 2nd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are business owners/operators within district boundaries.
- 3rd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employed by the City of Albany (employed at least 20 hours per week)
- 4th Priority: All other applicants.
- 1st Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employees of the Albany Unified School District (must work .40 FTE or more).
- 2nd Priority: Students whose parents/guardians are employed by the City of Albany, or employed within the district boundaries (employed at least 20 hours per week).
- 3rd Priority: Students whose siblings are ongoing interdistrict transfer students.
- 4th Priority: Students whose requests are based on a desire to ensure educational continuity
- 5th Priority: All other applicants.

Text Box 4

Regarding priorities 1 and 2, above, "employment" generally describes a relationship between an employer and an employee. An employee does not include one who performs services as an independent contractor, but does include a person who is self-employed with a permanent place of business within the boundaries of the district. Interdistrict transfer applications siting employment within district boundaries must be supported by written verification by the employer (or by the parent/guardian, if self-employed) of employment of at least twenty (20) hours per week and for at least thirty (30) weeks per year. Verification shall be attached to the original application for an interdistrict attendance permit, and to each subsequent application.

Regarding priority 4, above, "educational continuity" includes such considerations as the desire to complete the highest grade at a site or continuing education in the district after a number of years as a district student. Transfer requests also may be approved to allow a

student to complete a school year when the parent or guardian has moved out of the district during the year, or to continue attendance if the student will be living out of the district for less than one school year. Students who have moved out of the district and wish to remain in the district for the remainder of the year may stay pending approval by the new district of residence or an appeal of that district's decision to the Alameda County Office of Education, and a positive recommendation by the school principal.

Notwithstanding these priorities, the Superintendent/designee may grant a transfer if, in the judgment of the Superintendent/designee, the parents/guardians provide evidence of extraordinary circumstances (such as a threat of physical harm to a student) warranting a transfer.

Revocation of Interdistrict Attendance Permits

Every interdistrict attendance permit shall stipulate the terms and conditions under which the permit may be revoked. (Education Code 46600)

A student's Interdistrict Agreement may be revoked because of excessive truancy or continual disruption of the educational program as follows:

Grades K-5:

Attendance:	Four or more unverified or unexcused absences

Grounds for Revocation

Pursuant to Education Code section 46600, the following are the terms and conditions under which an interdistrict attendance permit may be revoked:

- 1. Determination by the district that the transfer request or supporting documentation was based upon false or fraudulent information.
- 2. Failure to comply with the requirements of the Interdistrict Transfer Student
 Contract, which include demonstrating acceptable academic performance,
 attendance, and behavior. The Contract must be signed by both the student and the
 parent/guardian.
- 3. Determination by the district that the conditions on which the interdistrict attendance permit approval was based are no longer met. It is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to notify the district within ten (10) thirty (30) days if any of the conditions justifying the transfer approval change. The student may be permitted, within the discretion of the Superintendent or designee, to complete the school year in the district with the approval of the district of residence.
- 4. Determination by the district that the continuing presence of the student is not in the student's best educational interest, or will interfere with the needs of other students, or both.

The district will give ten days' notice to a parent or guardian prior to the revocation of an interdistrict attendance permit.

Requests for Interdistrict Attendance Agreements Out of the District

Parents/guardians of students wishing to transfer out of the district shall complete an application for transfer. It is required that the parent/guardian of the applicant meet with the student's current school principal to discuss the reason for the transfer request and obtain his/her signature on the application.

Applications will be approved or denied by the Superintendent or designee. Applicants will be notified in writing if the request is denied, and will be given the reason for the denial. Denials by the district may be appealed to the district Board of Education. If the appeal is denied, the request may be appealed to the Alameda County Office of Education within thirty days of the district's final decision. Reasons for denial may include loss of district revenue to do the outgoing transfer of a student.

Applications that are approved by the district must also be approved by the receiving district. Parents should advise the Albany Unified School District of the final disposition of their request within five days of notification by the receiving district or the Alameda County Office of Education, in the case of an appeal.

Denial of Interdistrict Attendance Permit

The Superintendent or designee may deny initial requests for interdistrict attendance permits if school facilities are overcrowded at the relevant grade level or based on other considerations that are not arbitrary.

The Superintendent or designee shall notify the parents/guardians of a student who is denied interdistrict attendance regarding the process for appeal to the County-Board of Education as specified in Education Code 46601. (Education Code 46601)

(cf. 5145.6 - Parental Notifications)

Students who are under consideration for expulsion or who have been expelled may not appeal interdistrict attendance denials or decisions while expulsion proceedings are pending, or during the term of the expulsion. (Education Code 46601)

(cf. 5119 - Students Expelled from Other Districts) (cf. 5144.1 - Suspension and Expulsion/Due Process)

Transportation shall not be provided for students admitted pursuant to an Interdistrict Attendance Agreement.

Recommendation: 1) In the November 2010 election, that the Albany City Council approve the incentive of public financing of a candidate statement above the \$80 charge for any candidate who agrees to limit his/her campaign expenditures to a total of \$.70 per registered voter, and 2) that the Albany City Council put a measure on the November 2010 ballot to give voters a choice of whether and how to continue to provide public financing of ballot statements in future elections.

Background:

In 2009 the City Council received a report from the council's Ad Hoc Committee on Campaign Finance Reform. The committee informed the council that during their research they discovered that the taxpayers of Albany have been financing through the city's general fund candidates' statements above the approximate \$80 the city charges candidates. The public financing amounts to approximately \$525 per candidate; the total general fund expenditure for the 2008 election was between \$5,000-\$6,000.

Previously, the City Council directed the Social and Economic Justice Committee to make recommendations regarding campaign finance reform. The committee recommended to the council that the council provide incentives to candidates who accept a limit on campaign expenditures equal to \$.70 per registered voters.

The Future:

Since the financing of the campaign statements is paid for by taxpayers, the recommendation is that voters be given the choice of whether and how to finance the campaign statements at the November 2010 election. The measure may ask the following:

Should the taxpayers of Albany:

- 1) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective office in the city of Albany who agree to limit campaign expenditures to \$.70 per registered voter?
- 2) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of candidates for elective city offices in the city of Albany who agree to limit campaign expenditures to \$.70 per registered voter?
- 3) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective office in the city of Albany?
- 4) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective city offices in the city of Albany?
- 5) Provide no public funding for campaign statements of candidates for elective offices in the city of Albany?

The City Council may consider directing the Charter Review Committee to discuss and make recommendations about the ballot measure and language.

There are currently 9,887 registered voters in Albany, as of January 5, 2010; a campaign expenditure limit of \$.70 per voter x 9,887 voters = \$6,920.90.

Financial Impact:

Depending on the number of candidates in a given election and the total costs of the campaign statements, the city may incur costs of approximately \$3,000-10,000 per election.

In summary, the City has been subsidizing the cost of not only City candidates' statements but also School Board candidates' statements for longer than the historical memory of staff. The information has surfaced as part of the council's interest in campaign reform and the City staff interest in retaining a balanced budget. The decision to subsidize candidates' statements is not contained within the City Charter but rather in the resolution establishing election protocols.

The Council action was:

- 1) Refer the issue of the Candidate Statement fee to the Albany Unified School District.
- 2) Direct staff to prepare a report regarding the costs of the 2008 election.
- 3) Direct staff to include the number of candidates for the last three elections.
- 4) Report due back to Council the first meeting in June.

Should the City Council decide that they will no longer be able to subsidize Board of Education candidates' statements; the District appears to be prohibited from providing that subsidy under both the California Constitution and the Education Code. The expenditure may constitute an unconstitutional gift of public funds. The Constitution provides that no subdivision of the State (which includes school districts) may "have power to make any gift or authorize the making of any gift, of any public money or thing of value to any individual. . . ."

Cal. Const., art. XVI, § 6.)

Subsidizing a candidate's statement, for which the District receives no direct value in return, could constitute a gift or aid to an individual in violation of this provision.

The use of public funds and resources for the support of candidates is also prohibited by Education Code section 7054, subdivision (a). That section provides that "No school district . . . funds, services, supplies, or equipment shall be used for the purpose of urging the support of defeat of any ballot measure or candidate, including, but not limited to, any candidate for election to the governing board of the district."

A candidate's statement is generally an advocacy piece in favor of electing that candidate, and funding that statement in part with District funds appears to violate the express prohibition of section 7054. Violation of that section carries serious consequences, including the possibility of conviction of a misdemeanor or a felony, punishable by imprisonment in jail and/or a fine. (Ed. Code § 7054, subd. (c).) Note that the Education Code specifically provides that section 7054 overrides anything to the contrary in a city charter. (Id. § 7050.)

As a point of information, the council repealed the Campaign Reform Act of 1999, limiting campaign spending, after that last general election in 2009. The Board is being asked to respond to the following:

- 1. If the City Council decides not to subsidize candidate's statements, will/can AUSD continue the subsidy?
- 2. Does the Board of Education have a philosophical leaning in regards to any of the following ideas that the council is considering?

Should the taxpayers of Albany:

- 1) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective office in the city of Albany who agree to limit campaign expenditures to \$.70 per registered voter?
- 2) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of candidates for elective city offices in the city of Albany who agree to limit campaign expenditures to \$.70 per registered voter?
- 3) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective office in the city of Albany?
- 4) Fund the campaign statements above the \$80 threshold of all candidates for elective city offices in the city of Albany?
- 5) Provide no public funding for campaign statements of candidates for elective offices in the city of Albany?

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Albany Unified School District is seeking Board of Education approval to adopt a new Advanced Placement Statistics book for use at Albany High School starting in the 2010-11 school year. The AHS Math department currently uses the 3rd edition of Introduction to the Practice of Statistics by Moore and McCabe. This book was written in 1989, and updated in 1999.

AUSD is proposing the adoption the 3rd edition of <u>Stats: Modeling the World</u> by Bock, Velleman and De Veaux (BVD).

Statistics, particularly AP statistics is an evolving field. Methods, assumptions, and calculations are being re-evaluated by the professional community. A significant number of topics in the current book are no longer considered "best practice". Better methods have been developed for such basic concepts as calculating confidence intervals for an average value. Powerful calculators enable us to calculate what was once estimated; for example theoretical samples from a large population with a binomial distribution. With the current book, the teacher and students must carefully pick out the relevant information that is mixed in with outdated material, a difficult task when learning a complex subject.

The AP Statistics community generally recognizes three textbooks as the best to teach statistics to high school students and to maximize their achievement on the AP test. The adoption committee at AHS has carefully examined the three books, and found them all to be quite good. The committee has concluded that the BVD book is the easiest to understand of the three. The examples are very clear, and their context is accessible to all AHS students engaged in the study of Statistics. In addition, the BVD book re-uses some of the questions from the current textbook. If the BVD book is adopted, Statistics teachers will have two sources of questions for students to utilize in their studies.
