#### V. STUDENT BOARD MEMBERS

#### A) Student Reports

Student Member Chiang mentioned that the leadership class was working on different activities. Plans for Winter Ball is in the works. There is a community service group that is working on a canned food drive. A few weeks ago there was a memorial for Jesse Chow-Smith in which sudents folded paper cranes and gave to his family.

Member Yang presented the results of the dance survey. 717 surveys were partially and fully completed. Students want a greater variety of music. They stated there was hostility over being kicked out of dances and do not want to spend money just to go and get kicked out. There needs to be a better understanding of dance rules. More results were presented. Vice President Low asked if the survey was paper. Student Member Yang confirmed. Vice President Low recognized the work that goes behind paper surveys.

VII. PERSONS TO ADDRESS THE BOARD ON MATTERS NOT ON THE AGENDA
Stephen Naiff, 2nd grade teacher at Marin School and member of the District
Technology Committee, expressed concerns regarding the technology update
report on 10/20/09. Many teachers have concerns about technology. He
encouraged that a more collaborative approach be used. Vice President Low and
President Rosenbaum invited emails regarding this matter.

Marsha Skinner from the Albany Education Foundation stated that grants of over \$13,000 have been given for field trips. Wanted to be sure that Board was aware that there are needs that the District are not covering.

There will be a fundraising shopping day at Barnes and Noble on Saturday, 12/5/09 with 25% of proceeds going towards school library materials. Customers must state that they would like the procedes to go to the Albany Education Foundation.

Vice President Low asked if have scholarships have been given in the past for trips like Pt. Bonita. Ms. Skinner confirmed.

### **VIII.** REVIEW AND ACTION ITEMS

- A) Open Public Hearing for Public Disclosure of a Ratified Agreement between California School Employees Association (CSEA) and Albany Unified School District President Rosenbaum opened the Public Hearing.
- B) Close Public Hearing and Ratify Agreement between California School Employees Association (CSEA) and Albany Unified School District
  Superintendent Stephenson stated that this agreement will bring CSEA in line with other bargaining units. It gives no raise for this school year but preserves health and welfare benefits.
- C) Approve the Facilities Reorganization Plan as follows:
  - \* Move Albany Children's Center from 800 Red Oak Street to 720 Jackson Street. Related tenant improvements not to exceed \$75,000 in deferred maintenance funds.
  - \* Move Albany Unified District Office from 904 Talbot Avenue and Special Education Office from 601 San Gabriel to 1051 Monroe Street. Related tenant improvements not to exceed \$50,000 in deferred maintenance funds.
  - \* Move MacGregor High School from 720 Jackson Street to 601 San Gabriel. Related tenant improvements not to exceed \$150,000 in deferred maintenance and capital facilities funds.
  - \* Approve the Move of Albany Adult Education Offices from 601 San Gabriel to Albany High School at 1259 Brighton Avenue. Related tentative improvements not

### to exceed \$20,000 in deferred maintenance funds.

Superintendent Stephenson stated that pages 27 and 28 give a thorough explanation of the limitations the District has in regards to facilities. District is landlocked. This is an opporutnity to make moves that will solve problems that the District has had over the years. Discussion ensued. Generous offer from UC Village to relocate District Office to 1051 Monroe Street, the former Fire Department. Key element for moving District Office is to give Cornell School more space and possibly childcare facilities onsite.

Vice President Low said that senior citizens were emailing her with concerns that daytime classes would be elimated at the adult school. Suggests that this concern be brought up at the next 2x2x2 meeting, where the emails can be presented. Member Glasser asked when classes would be available. Superintendent Stephenson said that many day classes would continue to operate as long as they are financial viable. They will not be housed at 601 San Gabriel but instead at the Community Center and UC for ESL classes. Options will continue to be explored.

President Rosenbaum asked Superintendent Stephenson to explain Project Forward. Superintendent Stephenson said that the MacGregor model is predicated around the fact that continuation can only serve students 16 or older. There are times that students exhibit signs of failure early. The model that has been developed by Principal Ritchie and Principal Barone catches students early. They are concurrently enrolled in morning classes at the high school and remedial classes in the afternoon at MacGregor. Goal is to get kids caught up and grades and truancy issues solved before two years of failure. Vice President Low said it goes well with some Strategic Planning goals.
